



The use of the word "real" in CL, I'm still not sure that I've mastered the meaning of it.</p>  <p>Awww. You're trying to get on my good side, or launch me into "professor mode."</p> <p>I'll give you the short version, in hopes that I could give you the long version in person sometime.</p> <p>I came to study auroral plasma turbulence by a sequence of accidents (starting with a hobby I picked up in junior high school); and having started it, and enjoying it, continue to do it.</p> <p>I study plasma turbulence (a) because Mother Nature does it, so I/we study it; (b) because it is an interesting, and challenging target for radars (I have invented a kind of radar that I'm rather proud of, which does an extremely good job of looking at this turbulence); (c) auroral turbulence messes up radiowaves that travel through the ionosphere, like GPS and satellite TV and other things --- good to "understand the enemy" if you know what I mean; (d) I teach students about radar, and if they can understand how our radar works on a tricky target like auroral turbulence, they can pretty much understand anything.</p> <p>The "base" of the Northern Lights is about 100 km up; the lights extend upwards from there to about 300 km, and have a fairly distinct bottom, at the altitude where the turbulence happens.</p> <p>There are different types of visual aurora: "discrete" (like curtains),</p> |  |
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|  |  |  | <p>"diffuse" (whole region just kind of glowing), "corona" (a very pretty form of discrete aurora), "SAR-arcs" which is a more rare, but pretty spectacular deep blood red aurora (most visual aurora are green/white).</p> <p>[REDACTED]</p> <p>You're not going to let me off the hook, are you? :-) That's good. You have a refreshing and honest inquisitiveness that I am genuinely enjoying. I'll let you know if you ever cut too close to the bone, and I won't be mad, believe me.
